	• Our presupposition: We can trust what the Bible says, and we can trust the completeness of what it says.
3.	Is the Bible?
	 Our presupposition: If we believe that the Bible is true and trustworthy, then we believe that it is what it <u>claims</u> to be – the inspired Word of God. (2 Timothy 3:16)
	– refers to the Holy Spirit's work in the lives of the human authors of Scripture with the result that they wrote down what God desired to communicate. Completed work. ⁵
	– the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit to bring believers to understand the truth of Scripture. ⁶
